Council awards \$5,500 PR contract for village parking

A \$5,500 advertising and public relations contract with Patricia Darrough of Plus Four Advertising was approved last Thursday evening by the Capitola City Council.

Darrough will be designing the material that will be used by the city this summer to inaugurate its pay parking system in Capitola Village.

Parking banks - electronic ticket vendors that will dispense parking tickets to Village parkers — will be delivered and installed in the Village in approximately six weeks, City

The parking banks are the cornerstones of the city's Village Parking District program, and will supply most of the revenue needed to buy the Pacific Cove Mobile Home Park and eventually develop a portion of the park into village parking lot.

The city plans on spending \$864,400 for beach- and village-parking related activities in the 1984-85 fiscal year.
