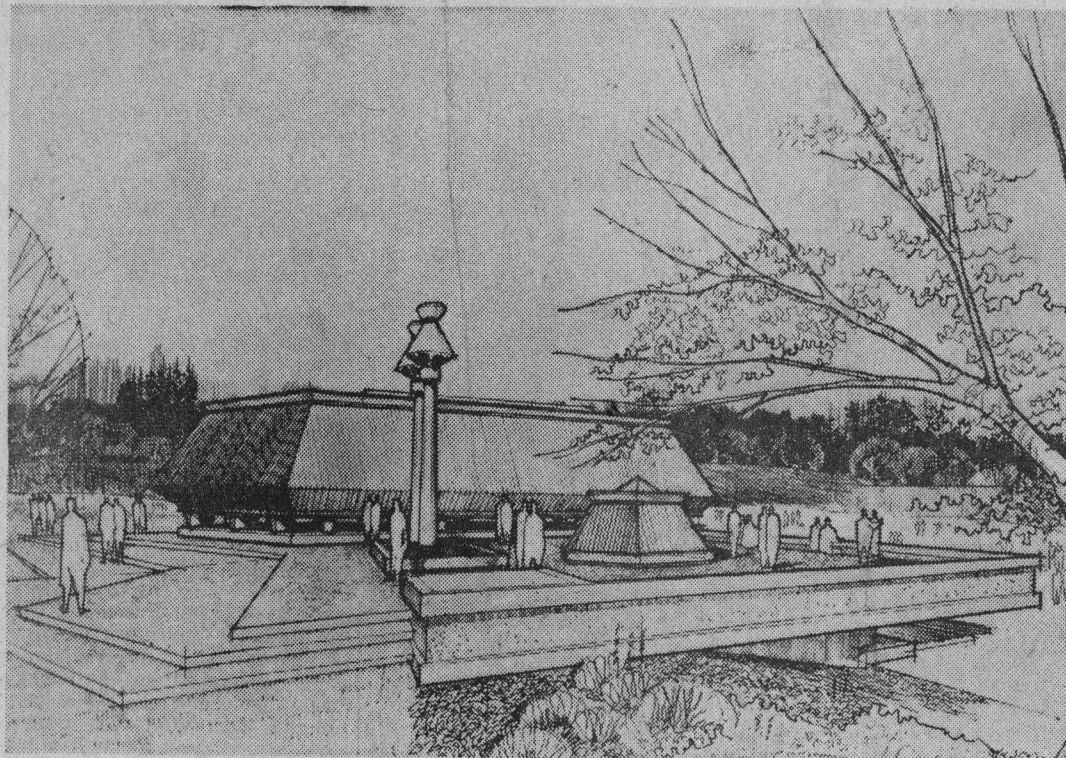


UCSC - History

will be built into a ridge, making it just one story high at ground level. This view shows the building from the west, with the one-story area appearing as a ground level terrace,

the ground dropping off to the east. Playing fields will be on the lower level to the right, and Cowell college will rise on a hill behind the field house.



Field House For UCSC Approved

Schematic drawings of the field house at the University of California at Santa Cruz have been approved by UC regents, it has been announced by UCSC Chancellor Dean E. McHenry and UC President Clark Kerr.

The architect is Callister, Payne and Rossi of Tiburon. The field house will contain 13,000 square feet, with physical education facilities and wall-folding bleachers seating about 200. The building is designed to accommodate meetings, lectures, concerts and other events, with an audience capacity of 700.

The interior will be acoustically treated, and a regulation basketball floor will be built. Adjoining the field house will be two outdoor tennis courts and playing fields for baseball, track and touch football.

Construction on the \$295,000 project will start early next year.
