An Old Courthouse Now Joins History

Santa Cruz County's old courthouse took the first step toward death yesterday.

Stones just beneath the cornerstone were removed and a tin-plated copper box of records sealed there in 1895 was taken

The land it is on should be sold, preferably to the city or other public agency for use as a park or part of a mall plan. The sale would include the sheriff's driveway, since a new, wider driveway now is planned.

But there were no tears shed for the old building.

However, two workmen startled a passerby the night before last when they were removing the corner stones to get at the records box.

"If we hurry, I think we can have the whole building down by morning," one remarked to the other. Eyes wide, the woman pedestrian stared in disbelief as the pair chipped industriously away at the building.
