Four provosts named at UCSC

SANTA CRUZ — New provosts have been named to head four of UC Santa Cruz's eight colleges.

Provosts are the administrative and academic heads of their respective colleges. They are responsible for academic and cultural programs at the colleges, as well as overseeing basic administrative details.

The four named are Carolyn Clark, Kresge College; Walter Goldfrank, College Eight; Maria Matute-Bianchi, Oakes College; and Carlos Norena, Stevenson College.

Clark, an associate professor of anthropology, earned her bachelor's degree and doctorate in anthropology from Michigan State University. She joined the UCSC faculty in 1972. Her research centers on social theory, African women and sexuality, and political economy.

Goldfrank, a professor of sociology, came to UCSC in 1968 after earning a bachelor's degree in social relations from Harvard University and a doctorate in sociology from Columbia University. His research interests include social change, historical sociology and world systems.

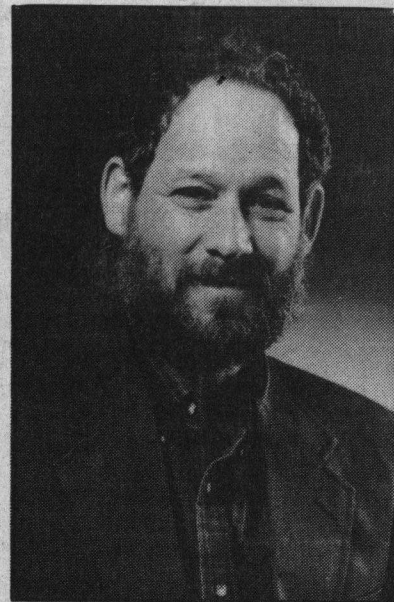
Matute-Bianchi, an associate professor of education, will serve as acting provost at Oakes College through Dec. 31. She earned a bachelor's degree in sociology from Pomona College, a master's degree in anthropology from Stanford University and a doctorate in education and anthropology, also from Stanford. She studies the education of minority groups and women in education.

Norena is a professor of philosophy who holds advanced degrees in philosophy, theology and civil law from several universities in

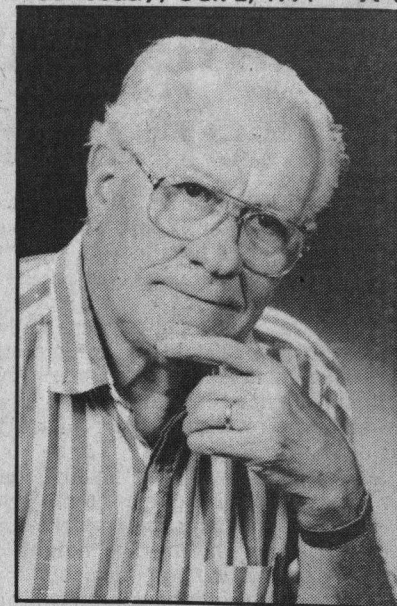
Europe as well as a doctorate in philosophy from UC San Diego. He came to UCSC in 1967 and was chairman of the philosophy department for five years. His research concerns the history of philosophy, with an emphasis on renaissance philosophy.
