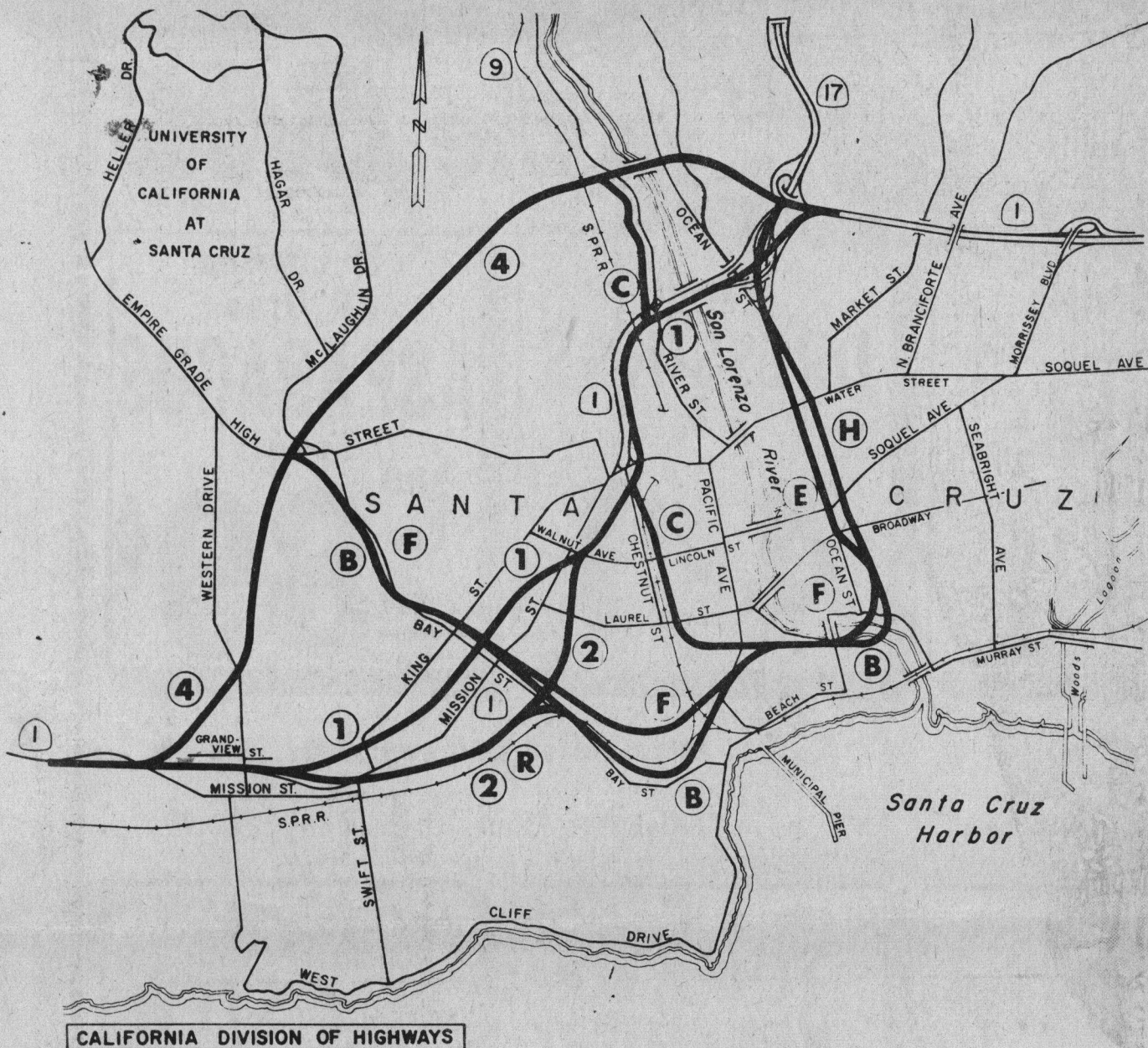


State proposes freeway, SC beach loop

Quick Click—The Outdoor Breakfast

The cool breeze of the open prairie, the soft whisper of air moving through tall trees, the bracing wind of sea and shore beckon folks to breakfast when they carry the aroma of food cooking over the coals.

The most tantalizing of invitations to greet an out-of-doors day is wafted with the aroma of toasting Swiss-Canadian Breakfast Sandwiches. This is the mainstay of a menu which can be brought from home and turned into a quick-click of a meal. One look at the menu reveals the short cuts.

- Chilled Golden Wedges of Cantaloupe
- Hard-cooked Eggs
- Swiss-Canadian Breakfast Sandwiches (ready for toasting)

- Pecan Coffee Cake
- Milk or other Beverage

Swiss-Canadian Breakfast Sandwiches

- 8 slices enriched bread
- 8 slices Swiss cheese
- 4 slices Canadian bacon
- 12-16 orange sections

Place a slice of cheese on each of four bread slices; top each with a slice of Canadian bacon and three or four orange sections, then another cheese slice. Complete sandwiches with remaining bread slices. Place sandwiches in a wire grill and toast on both sides over medium hot coals.

Yield: 4 Swiss-Canadian Breakfast Sandwiches.

A public hearing will be held July 20 at 1 p.m. in Santa Cruz civic auditorium regarding locations of expanded Route 1 and the proposed Route 100, which would form a loop around the downtown Santa Cruz business district and distribute traffic downtown as well as to beach areas. Alternate routes were presented Santa Cruz city council at its recent meeting. Prior to the public hearing, map displays will be available with locations and dates to be announced.

The two routes form a network of state highways and many combinations of alternatives are available. The state division of highways which made the studies said effect of the various routes on the community and the aesthetic potential of design and areas through which the alternate routes pass, have been carefully considered. Land use patterns, planning and traffic projections for the immediate and distant future have been studied, together with city street network capacity. In the map above, freeway alternate routes are designated by numbers 1, 2 and 4. Loop alternates are noted by letters.
