United Presbyterian Church celebrates milestone

150th anniversary to be marked Sunday by displays, food, music and speakers

Watsonville United Presbyterian Church will celebrate its 150th anniversary Sunday with music, food and an opportunity to learn about the history of the church, which dates back to the days before railroads arrived in the area.

Midge Morrison, 84, moved to Watsonville in 1956 and immediately joined the church.

"Belonging to something as vital as the church is very important to me," she said. "I think the anniversary is very significant. It's amazing, in this day and age, when anything lasts that long."



Morrison said that the church is involved with many service projects that help the community, including helping the Salvation Army provide a weekly meal to needy people.

The church distributes food to 75 needy families. In addition, the church was one of the first organizations to become a food distribution center for Second Harvest Food Bank, said pastor Bruce Rowlison.

"It's our identity," he said of the church's efforts to help those in need. "It's who we are."

The celebration will include speakers, lunch and music, which will be a mixture of traditional gospel hymns and the more upbeat, modern music that the church has adapted in an effort to attract younger members.
