## Nine Named To Cedar-Vine Project Study Committee

Three city councilmen and six other Santa Cruzans have been named to a committee to study the dormant Cedar-Vine street linkup project, Mayor Norman Walters has announced.

The committee, whose formation was directed by the council this fall, will review the entire history of the Cedar-Vine project in the light of current developments, and then submit recommendations to the council about financing methods, possible realignment of the proposed street, and proposals for a bigger district to share the project cost.

The original proposal, which died in a storm of protest, was for formation of a downtown assessment district, measured in concentric zones of benefit ranging from 100 per cent to 10 per cent, to pay the estimated \$600,000 cost. Most of the cost was in property acquisition.

City officials consider the street an essential link in longrange plans for downtown streets and traffic circulation patterns, Named to the committee were councilmen Norman Lezin, Dick Hackbarth and Samuel Leask, along with Paul Sandas, Walter Bettencourt, Ted Schipper, Donald Younger, Laurence Canfield and Ted Foster.
