Rees said that the governor's office wanted the delay due to a "little ambiguity" on the matfor and hth encon vice President James Corley of the university said that the plans for the \$3 million appropriation carried a condition: That none of the money would be spent on the proposed campus in Santa Clara or Santa Cruz counties until there had been a conference on the entire proposal between the governor, US regents, the department of finance and legislators in the area.

Coolidge said today that the cou vis nor thr Cer F pol ma; pos ept viso F of est Coolidge said today that the believe the \$3 million program still had the approval of the governor's office. The proposal is scheduled to go before a senate finance subcommittee this week. who all Boa ere (So tell Meanwhile, the proposed mas-ter plan for higher education ran into trouble at a hearing of the ng is-na. hs, (Br he senate education committee.
