


The Bells' home furnishes an elegant setting for their treasures collected during official sojourns and trips to Japan, Hong Kong, the Philippines, Malaysia and Indo-

Ambassador Bell is now a lecturer at Merrill College, University of California Santa Cruz. He held State Department posts in South America and Indonesia prior to serving as Ambassador to Malaysia from 1964-69.

The Bells' Oriental art objects and batiks are outstanding. And they are shown against a background of museum quality furniture.

There's a round table in the library on which Harriet Beecher Stowe wrote UNCLE TOM'S CABIN. In the dining room there's a sideboard that was brought from England about 1800 by a family member who became governor, senator, then chief justice of the New Hampshire Colony.

Fine Coromandel screens stand behind contemporary upholstered pieces in the living room. An old pigskin box from "old" Japan is a treas-ure. Blue and white porcelains, fine carvings and old bronze pieces have their place in the decor.

Jewel-like batiks are displayed throughout the house but are clustered in a hall stairway where an ancient carved lantern from Penang lights the way.
