☛ UCSC received a \$6.4 million grant from the U.S. Department of Education to coordinate the new National Center for Research on Cultural Diversity and Second Language Learning.

☛ UCSC was designated as one of eight collaborating institutions of the new Southern California Earthquake Center, established this year by the National Science Foundation and the U.S. Geological Survey.

☛ McHenry Library celebrated the acquisition of its millionth volume and unveiled a major gift—the distinguished Trianon Press Archive.

☛ The John Simon Guggenheim Memorial Foundation honored two UCSC faculty members—sociologist Joseph Collins and astrophysicist Douglas Lin—with fellowships.

☛ The National Science Foundation named four assistant professors as Presidential Young Investigators, making a total of ten UCSC faculty who have received that honor since the award was established in 1983.

☛ History of consciousness professor Hayden White was named University Professor by the UC Regents—one of only sixteen in the entire university system.

☛ UCSC physicists were chosen to oversee the development of the critical central core of one of the United States' Superconducting Super Collider's two
