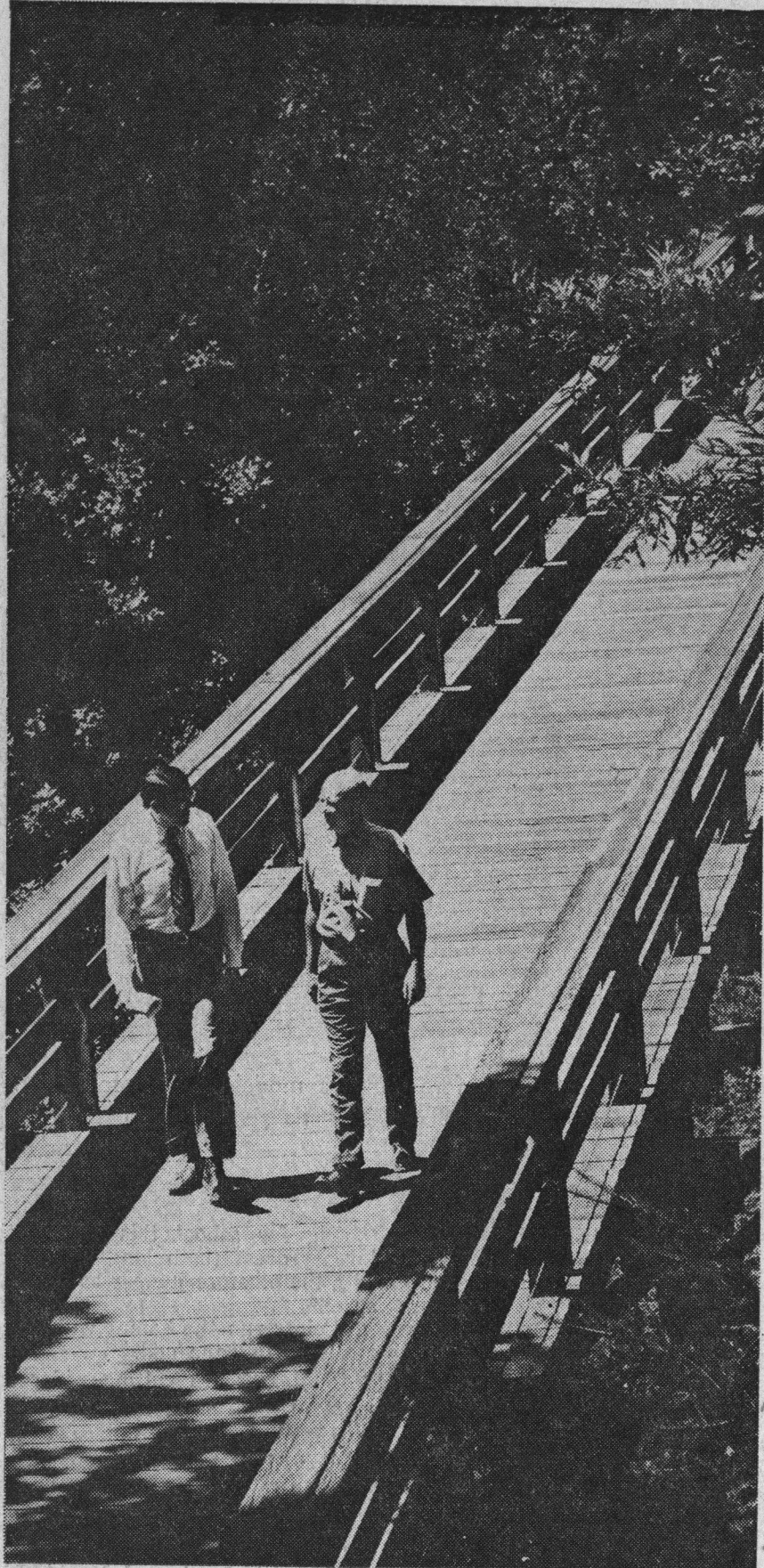

A Chancellor's Decade



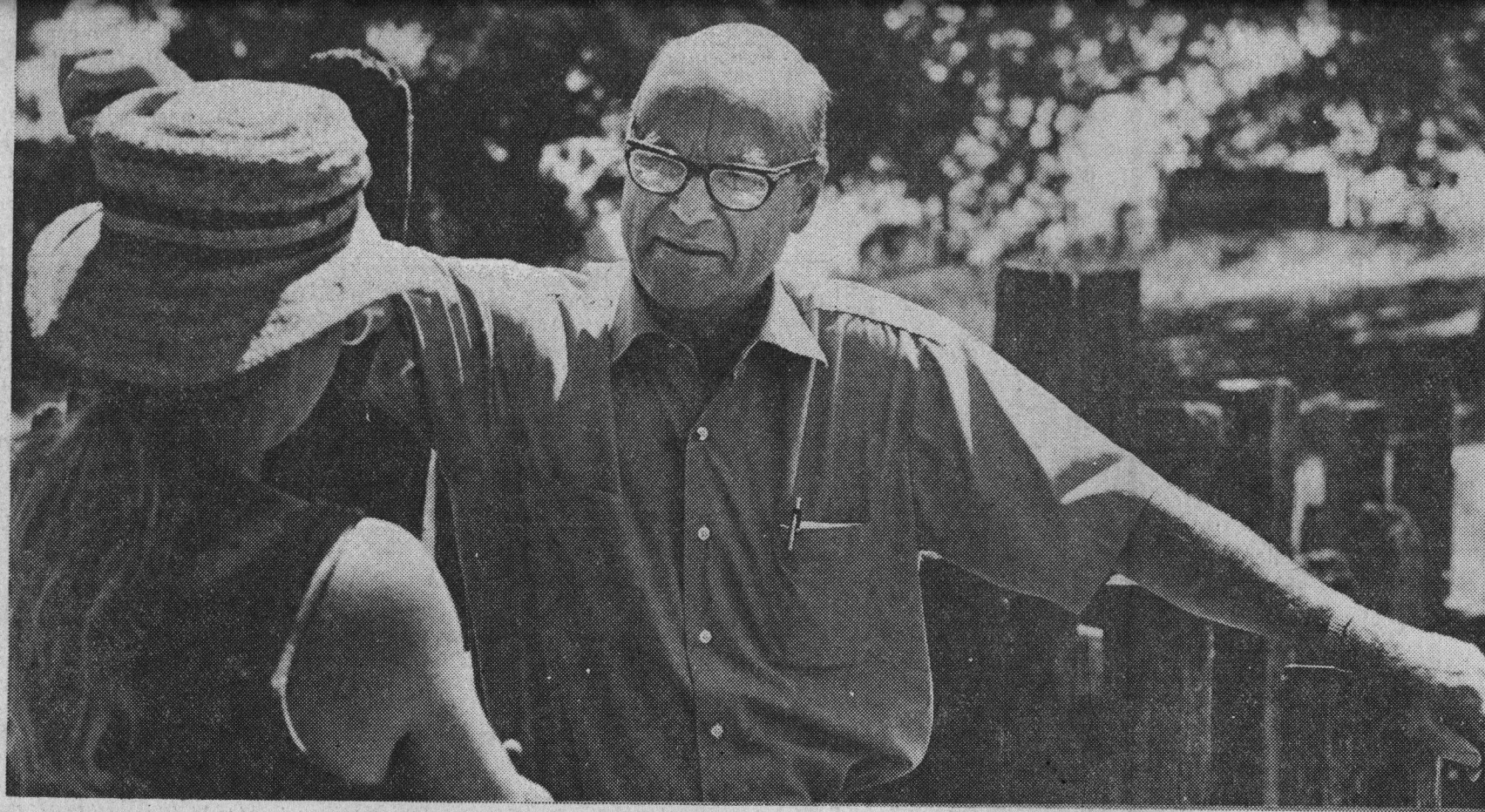

Ten years and a few weeks ago, Dean McHenry moved his family to Santa Cruz. At 51, he had been named chancellor of a new university which didn't exist in the rolling hills and green forests of the old Cowell Ranch.

Now he walks among his works, though the campus is not finished. His life is social as well as administrative; personal as well as public. He is a farmer in Bonny Doon where he owns a home, and runs a tractor on his land. He talks with Tom O'Leary, university relations officer, while crossing a wooden bridge over a tree-covered canyon, or faces a student at UCSC's Farm Project. Or he proudly stands with his wife Jane, and dog, Fritz, pointing out features of University House where countless receptions are held.
