Camp Harmon, Easter Seal camp for crippled children, opened sessions last week with its first group of children totaling 64, according to Executive Director Gary Irwin. Of this number, 30 are receiving speech aid and 34 are orthopedically handicapped.

Camp director is Robert Moody, son of Mr. and Mrs. George Moody of Santa Cruz. Assistant camp director is Ann Hallum of Susanville.

The current camp session ends July 2 and the next one starts July 4, Irwin announced. The staff includes nearly 30 counselors and about 12 kitchen and maintenance workers.

The camp makes possible a camping experience for handicapped children from all parts of California.
