Water-Filled **Auto Bumpers Key To Safety**

San Francisco (AP)-A water filled automobile bumper?

Yes, says inventor John W. Rich of Sacramento who demonstrated them Thursday at Candlestick Park.

The bumper is made of vinyl plastic, with walls a quarter-inch thick, and carrying about seven

When the bumper hits a pole the water is forced by the impact through capped holes along the top of the bumper. Rich says the water and not the driver thereby absorbs the impact's

Demonstration cars slammed together at 30 miles an hour with no injury to drivers.

Rich said the bumpers cost less than \$200 for cars and \$300 for trucks. He said he had sold them to police in Santa Monica and Culver City.
