Magnitude of main earthquake: 7.1

Length of time shaking was felt: 15 to 40 seconds

Length of time main shock reverberated in the Santa Cruz Mountains: Up to 6 minutes

Number of aftershocks over 3.0 magnitude in first month: 90

Of those, number which were 4.0 or larger: 22

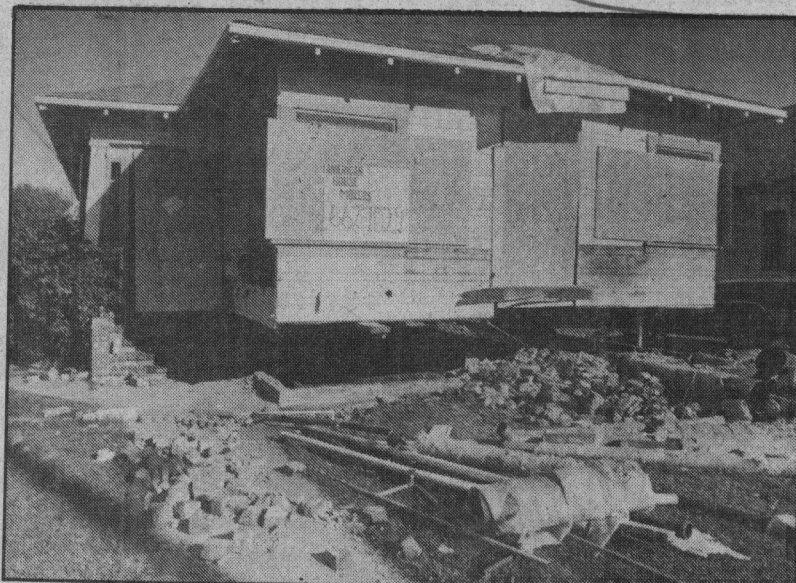
Largest aftershock: 5.2 magnitude, 37 minutes after main quake

Second largest aftershock: 5.0 magnitude, 3:14 a.m. Oct. 19

Chances of a 6.0 magnitude aftershock in the next two months: 3 percent

Chances of a 5.0 magnitude aftershock in the same period: 20 percent
