## Marianne's Ice Cream opening in Seacliff

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APTOS - Marianne's, the iconic Santa Cruz ice cream, is coming to Aptos - specifically 218 State Park Drive in Seacliff, across from Sno-White Drive-In.

The owners of Marianne's Ice Cream, a landmark on Ocean Street in Santa Cruz, took over operations March 1 at the Seacliff Center Market from owner Dan Holdren.

"I couldn't be happier," said Holdren, 62, explaining that he called Marianne's to let the owners know the property was available. "These people are the heart and soul of Santa Cruz business."

Charlie Wilcox and Kelly Dillon, who bought Marianne's from longtime owners Sam and Dorothy Lieberman at the end of 2012, had pondered the idea of a second location before Sam died at 84 late in November.

"He gave us really good advice," said Wilcox, who invited Dorothy to the official hand-off Monday and wore his trademark suspenders and a straw fedora for the photo opportunity.

When Holdren made the call in December, "it was perfect tim-

ing," said Wilcox.
"It came together quick," said Dillon, noting the market building was put up in 1947, the same year as the Marianne's barn-red building. "That was fate."

The new owners plan to drop sales of lottery tickets and tobacco and expand grilling and picnic selections with an emphasis on local products.

"If they sell coffee and pastries, they'd have us hooked," said Rebecca Downing, president of the Seacliff Improvement Association, noting residents must make a hazardous walk on a freeway overpass to reach the closest coffee shop. "Folks in Seacliff have been waiting a long time for

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things in our downtown."

The plea for coffee will not be ignored.

"We got the message," said Wilcox. Added Dillon, "We're talking with coffee roasters."

The couple expects to be scooping ice cream in two or three months. They need new signs, and a lot more. They have to install freezers, a dishwasher and other restaurant equipment, and pass county inspections, which Wilcox said may necessitate occasional

And they need employees. Wilcox expects to hire seven to eight part-time employees and one or two working full-time to keep scooping ice cream until midnight.

Holdren declined to provide details of the transaction.

He started working at the market when he was a fourth grader and has been running the place with the help of just one other person. Last year, he put the 2,000-square foot market up for lease.

He said the property has been in his family for 54 years and has offered to work two shifts per week at the new

said, noting the proximity to two of the most visited state parks, Seacliff State Beach, which is No. 4, and New Brighton State Beach, which is also highly visited.

The property has a gated courtyard, with mature hedges, an avocado tree planted by Holdren and a drainage area that flows to the ocean. Outdoor seating could be possible if the county installed a culvert, Holdren said.

Other improvements on the horizon for Seacliff include undergrounding utility poles, a new park on McGregor

Drive and new sidewalks, a median and planters, a removal of a retaining wall for another right turn lane by the Sno-White Drive-In.

Residents are pleased with changes new owner Bob Tapella brought to The Mediterranean restaurant and have organized gardening and cleanup par-

The triangle property "got a huge haircut, it looks so much better," said Downing.
