

In the joint class of Miss Kendall and Gerald Towner, Miss Kendall teaches the two classes music and Spanish. Towner turns his talents to the sciences.

Across a hall, the two classes of Alan Poteete and Robert Tracy have undergone a similar change and there, also, the teachers devote their time to the large class, teaching their specialties.

The two enlarged classrooms can undergo still another metamorphosis. Walls in the corridor separating the two enlarged classrooms can be removed and the classroom is the one of 142 pupils.

"This larger class is brought about only for instruction in music or when we have a film," Miss Kendall said. "When Mrs. Jean Knight, city music supervisor, comes to the school on Wednesdays, all the walls or curtains are moved and she has the attention of all the students at once."
