S Coastal panel to review county request

The county's request to exclude certain types of developments and activities in the Coastal Zone from having to get coastal permits will be considered by the state Coastal Commission Nov. 19 in El Segundo.

Those who wish to comment on the matter, but who can't travel to the Hacienda Hotel in El Segundo, can attend a meeting Tuesday at noon in the fourth floor conference room of the County Center.

Comments made at the local meeting will be passed on to the state commission Nov. 19.

Supervisors are asking that the following developments and activities be excluded from the coastal permit require-

ment: 1-4 unit residential developments within the urban boundary, agriculturally-related development, tree removal, land clearing, boundary adjustments, grading and obtaining permits for encroachment, street closures, burning and spraying.

The Coastal Commission staff is recommending a negative declaration be adopted on the exclusions. A negative declaration states that since no significant environmental impacts would result from the exclusions, a complete environmental impact report isn't needed.

If the exclusions are adopted by the commission, they will be brought back before the Board of Supervisors for final approval.
