Jr. Rifle Range Needs More Funds

The junior rifle range on Graham Hill road is having its troubles.

C. E. "Doc" Fehlman, secretary of the Santa Cruz Safety Council, said today that a snag in obtaining insurance funds has arisen.

He said the first year's insurance money was secured by donations from people and organizations who were interested. "An attempt to have the Safety Council assume this cost was denied by the board of supervisors," he said.

"If the range is to function in the years to come, the insurance money will have to be raised by individuals and organizations. Sportsmen's organizations, companies and corporations will benefit by having the boys shoot at the range under competent instructors, and not at sign board insulators, etc.," said Fehlman.

He asked that contributions be sent to R. F. Hansen, safety council president, at 323 Spring street or to himself at 330 High street.

Full coverage is required for the operation of the range.

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
