

New Juvenile Hall Site Proposals Due

Juvenile Justice commissioners tomorrow night will be asked to change their recommendation on a north Ocean street site for a new \$500,000 juvenile hall.

San Lorenzo Supervisor Vincent Locatelli said today he will suggest that the commission and county judges drop all three proposed Ocean street sites from consideration because of determined opposition against the hall there.

"We're going to bring some different sites to the commission and the judges for them to consider," Locatelli declared.

Three members of a site selection committee and Locatelli are to set out tomorrow to look at other locations. Public Works Director Warren Harrison, Planning Director Bert Muhly, and County Counsel William Card will accompany Locatelli.

Two possible alternatives al-

ready mentioned by the supervisor include the 37-acre Cowell property on Graham Hill road and the county's own equipment yard on Holohan road near Watsonville.

By law, the presiding juvenile court judge must approve any site locations. Superior Court Judge Gilbert Perry is presiding juvenile judge at present, but is expected to consult with fellow jurist, Judge Charles Franich.

Judge Perry said today he will not attend tomorrow night's meeting of the juvenile justice commission.

"We will take the report after the commission acts," Judge Perry said. "I don't plan to attend because I don't like to interfere with the judgment of the commission."

Opposition of property owners in the area of the IOOF cemetery and in Paradise Park has been near - unanimous against locating a juvenile hall there. North Ocean street connects with Powder Mill road, which crosses the east section of Paradise Park.

Judge Perry and the juvenile justice commission suggested three possible locations there two weeks ago.
