Civil Service - County 5-4-5

Board Okays 5 Per Cent Salary Raise

The bulk of the package of salary recommendations gained approval of the board of supervisors shortly before noon today in a unanimous motion calling for a 5 per cent increase in salary for county employees outside of a job classification with a \$7000 per year top step.

Supervisor Hulda McLean, who initiated the measure, explained the motion will make it possible for the board to study the proposed salary hikes for employees in the higher pay brackets before taking further action.

Other recommendations from the civil service commission for salary boosts will be decided upon by the supervisors next Monday. Supervisor Lewis Nelson requested a delay to give more study to the proposals.

Personnel Director John Toombs said he will determine the number of persons affected by the 5 per cent boost and the total amount the county will outlay.
