Moore interrupted Pauley.

Students, in unison, clapped their hands and chanted.

Then, turning his back to the Regents, Moore faced the stu-dents and said, "You asked last night for an expression from the Regents. They have spoken. A black man has nothing to say to them. Goddamn it, if they can't give a black man education, what the hell can they give him!"

Students shouted, "Recognize him!" and when Pauley again tried to resume his remarks, and "No! No! Shame profanities and "No! No! Shame! Shame! Shame!"

Amid the din, the committee concluded its discussion of the pending session, voted, and Carter banged the gavel, adjourning the meeting.

Students chanted, "Don't go! Don't go!"

Others shouted, "Let's the place up! Tear it up!"

Following the meeting, students cornered Regents and other university officials to press their demands for action on Malcolm X College, on support of the grape boycott, and on easing the Regents' Septem-20 resolution restricting ber Black Panther Eldridge Cleaver's' appearances on the Berkeley campus.

That resolution, in McHenry's view, is the "basic problem" that aggravated the demonstration. "This is the first Regents" meeting since Los Angeles," the chancellor said.

He noted that the issue generated widespread concern

among students and faculty regarding academic freedom.
