Green And Snyder Hired

Cabrillo College Begins Hiring Teachers For Fall

Two Santa Cruz high school instructors were offered contracts for positions with Cabrillo college at a meeting of the junior college board this morning.

They are: Alpheus Green, mathematics instructor and head of the high school science and math department; and Drennen "Jack" Snyder, activities director and business instructor. If the two accept the contract offers they will start instructing this September at temporary quarters at the Watsonville high school.

Green, who would instruct math, obtained his AB and MA at the University of Wisconsin. He has taught at the high school since 1938.

Snyder, who is activities director and teaches a business class, has an AB from San Jose State college, and an MA from Stanford university. He has been with the high school since 1951.

The board also unanimously made three other appointments following recommendations of Dr. Robert Swenson, college president. They are:

Director of business: Leland W. Harris, presently assistant superintendent in charge of business for Marin county schools. He has his masters degree from Stanford university and has served as assistant under Dr. Wallace Hall, associate superintendent, state department of education. His salary will be \$12,000.

Counselor, psychology and sociology instructor: Malby Roberts, who has held the same positions for three years at Bakersfield city college. He has his masters degree from Stanford. His yearly salary will be \$7100.

Librarian: Fred Y. Osborne, who is head librarian for the past six years at the Long Beach City college. Osborne holds two masters degrees—one in history from Southern Methodist university, and another in library science from Denver university. He was librarian at Baylor university for five years. His salary will be \$8500.

Reports in a Monterey county

paper that Cabrillo would field a football team this year were reported unfounded by Dr. Swenson. He said it would be impossible to establish a team for conference play before 1960-61. However, the board did discuss possible affiliation with the Coast conference for basketball, baseball, tennis, swimming, and possibly track. The conference includes the following junior colleges: Foothill, Hartnell, Menlo, Monterey, San Jose and Vallejo.

Government Plant Sought For Area

A government plant for experimental conversion of sea water may be built near Santa Cruz, Water Department Director Weston Webber reported.

The plant is scheduled to be constructed between San Diego and San Francisco, and Santa Cruz was one of the communities invited to apply for the experimental station.

However, the city's bargaining position was indicated by some of the questions listed on the federal form.

How much would Santa Cruz be willing to contribute to the cost of the plant? How much would it pay for the water produced? Would the site be made available free? Will technical assistance be available?

The plant will be part of a department of the interior drive to accelerate development of a practical and economically competitive process for salt water conversion.
