No leads on missing woman

SANTA CRUZ — The Federal Bureau of Investigation reported "no new developments" after an air search over the Vienna Woods area for a missing Aptos woman.

FBI and Sheriff's Office officials flew over the area in a helicopter for several hours Friday.

"There are no new new developments," said an FBI spokesman following the search for 25-year-old Arlene Kazuko Tsuji, who disappeared Oct. 24.

Law enforcement officials fear Tsuji has been abducted. According to authorities, Tsuji never returned from a routine stroll she took near her Vienna Woods home.

Co-workers at a Capitola travel-tour company where Tsuji works notified authorities when she failed to report to work the next morning.

Family, friends and the traveltour company are offering a \$15,000 reward for information that leads to finding Tsuji.

Explorer Scouts, Cabrillo College police and sheriff's detectives are scheduled to do a "limited" ground search today around the area she may have

disappeared.

Volunteers and investigators have repeatedly combed the area searching for clues.

Tsuji is described as Asian, 5 feet tall, around 103 pounds, with straight, brownish-black shoulder-length hair and brown eyes. She was last seen wearing a gray, long-sleeve pullover sweatshirt with a hood and black baggy cotton shorts with cuffs.
