Off the patio a putting green being developed for hotel guests.


MacDonald said future plans include a glass elevator which will take guests up and down the beach cliff.

Coupled with the hotel is the Aptos Beach Golf club house and 18 hole course. Course fees are \$3 for week days and \$4 for weekends. For nine holes the price is half in both cases.

The dining room in the golf club house can accommodate from 80 to 100 persons for breakfast or lunch. It is open every day except Mondays.

The hotel and golf course is owned by the Tellyer Industries. Harry Tellyer, of Texas is president.
