PRIZES — All registered runners will be eligible for the special prize drawing at 10:30 a.m. The awards ceremony will follow. Postrace festivities will be on Capitola Beach.

when — July 28, 1985, at 8:30 a.m. Entry packets and gift packs may be obtained at race head-quarters at the Dream Inn, on the beach near Santa Cruz Municipal Wharf from noon to 6 p.m., or on race day beginning at 6 a.m.

WHERE — The 5.813-mile race starts at the Santa Cruz Municipal Wharf with a dash down Beach Street, past the Boardwalk, crosses the San Lorenzo River Bridge and meanders through Seaside neighborhoods to the yacht harbor.

The middle of the course skirts Twin Lakes Beach, then winds along Schwan Lake and Corcoran Lagoon wildlife sanctuaries before opening into the ocean bluffs at Pleasure Point. The last mile slopes down into the village of Capitola-by-the-Sea, past its wharf, to finish on the beach esplanade.
