

Regents look at future fee increases

BERKELEY, Calif. (AP) — A committee of the University of California Board of Regents today considered a pair of proposals to raise student fees by \$291 in the 1983-84 school year, bringing to \$1,391 the total fees paid by undergraduates each year.

The proposals included a \$267 increase in the regular educational fee paid by students on each of the university's nine campuses. Students currently pay \$525 a year and were assessed a \$100 surcharge for the current quarter to help offset cuts in state funding.

The second proposal would raise the university registration fee from \$510 a year to \$534 a year in an effort to offset inflation, university officials said.

The regents' Finance Committee also considered an increase in the non-resident fee from \$3,150 to \$3,360.

The full Board of Regents were scheduled to discuss the increases in a meeting Friday.
