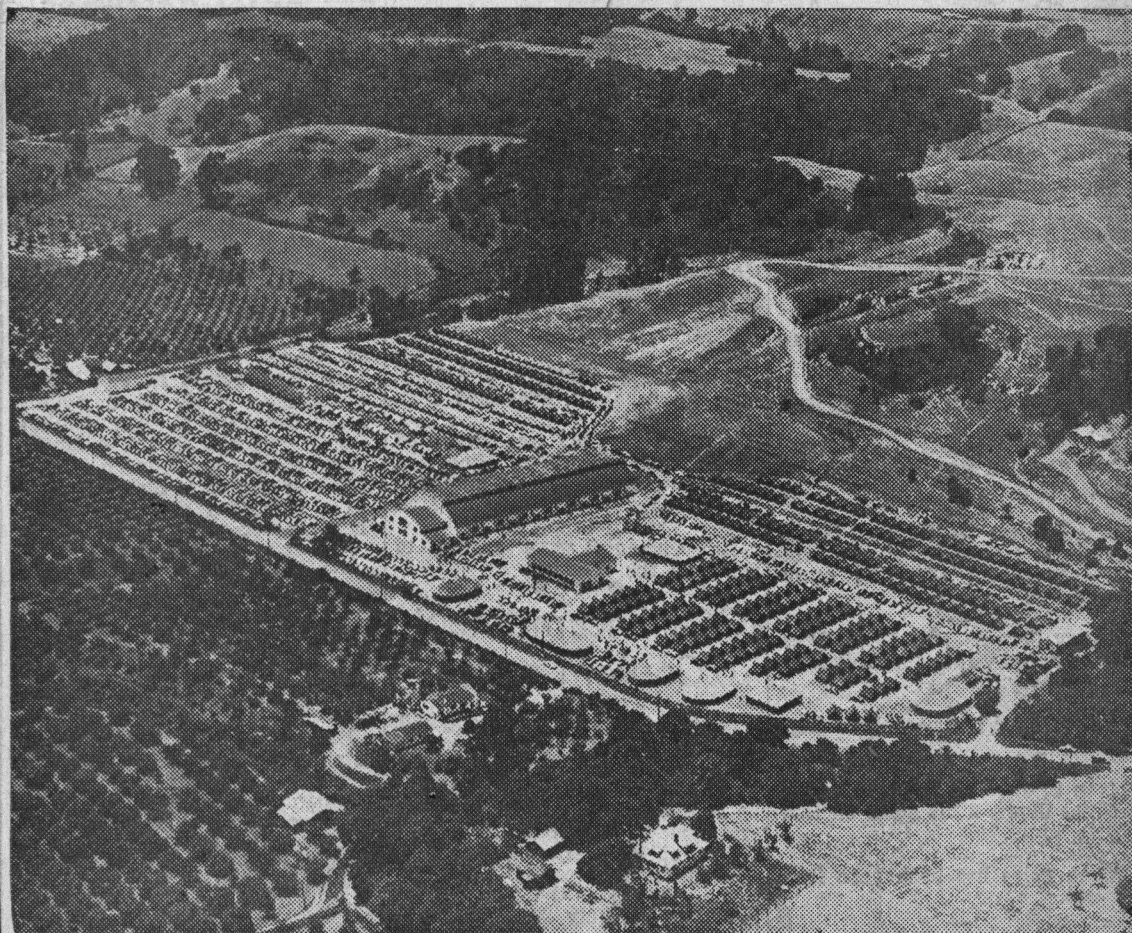


'City Of Tents' For 5000 Seventh-Day Adventists



This aerial photo gives a good over-all view of the 80-acre campgrounds on Old San Jose road, two miles north of Soquel, where the annual Seventh-day Adventists Central California conference began today and will continue through Saturday, July 28. More than 5000 will attend and the 500 family tents set up by 34 preachers of the church in the central area are already occupied and more orders have been received. Many private tents have been pitched and

there are a large number of house trailers already on the grounds. All indications point to the largest conference attendance to date, according to Elder E. G. Annofsky, chairman of the reception committee.

"Are we nearing Armageddon, the Final Clash of Arms?" will be the subject of Evangelist D. E. Venden at the opening meeting tonight in the huge auditorium, it was reported by R. C. Baker of San Jose, president of the Central California conference. The sermon will begin at 8.

The song service, which will be held nightly at the same hour, will begin at 7:30 o'clock. Those who enjoy congregational singing will find this service a most enjoyable one. President Baker said.

There will be a special service daily—10:30 a.m. and 8 p.m.
