Board Roundup

Aptos Area Seeks New Library

Supervisors' Chairman Lewis Nelson said he hopes the Aptos area will follow the path broken by other communities in the county which acquired their own buildings for library facilities.

His statement came Monday after a letter from Jessie Elliott informed the board that a group of Aptos area citizens have been working over the past years to get more adequate facilities.

Mrs. Elliott said a number of Aptos residents are ready to make "generous" contributions for a new library.

"I'm happy to hear this," Nelson said. "There is a need in Aptos for a better library."

Other business which came before the board Monday included:

ZONING — The board adopted ordinances rezoning these areas: former Supervisor Hulda McLean's Rancho del Oso off the Oceanshore highway to a recreational (REC) district; property in the King's creek area to agriculture with 10-acre minimum lots (A-10); property in Bonny Doon to A-5.

ROAD NAME — The board delayed for one week a decision on renaming Old Mount Hermon road. The county planning commission recommended the name "Depot road." Supervisor Vince Locatelli asked for postponement because the Felton Businessmen's association wants a week to consider the matter. The association previously had favored the name of "Roaring Camp road."

ROAD NAME POLICY — Supervisors went along with a planning commission recommendation that all future naming of roads or renaming be referred to the commission for review. Supervisor Robert Burton termed it a "very good suggestion." The commission will check out any possible duplications and determine if the road name is proper.

ACCEPTING ROADS — The board accepted into the county road system the streets in Boulder Creek Country Club Estates unit No. 2.

ROAD ABANDONMENT — A public hearing was set for August 26 at 10:30 a.m. to consider abandoning a right-of-way off East Cliff drive at the north end of Twin Lakes beach. A proposal to exchange the small parcel for two acres on Olive Springs road will be considered then.

SUBDIVISION — The board approved the final map for Park Wilshire subdivision, tract No. 388, in Aptos.
