Loch Lomond's 50-year celebration on tap

City to offer discounts at popular destination to highlight its role in history

FELTON — Originally, there were to be 19 reservoirs snaking through valleys in the Santa Cruz Mountains, a proposal that would have dramatically altered not only the local landscape, but water policy debates that persist decades later.

But there is only one. And Saturday marks the 50th anniversary of the dedication of Newell Creek Reservoir, a valuable source of water for the city of Santa Cruz and a recreational hub better known by the name
