Beach Company, the Santa Cruz Operation, Pro-Log, and the Monterey Bay Hotel have in common?

They're members of University of California Extension's Monterey Bay Consortium, a group of public and private organizations in Monterey and Santa Cruz counties that work together with extension to provide employees with the best in training and education.

Consortium members and extension staff meet to decide what kind of continuing education classes would be most useful for area employees. Extensions then finds instructors, schedules the classes, takes care of other logistics, and employers receive a fee discount on class costs. Employees enroll on the classes at their place of work. (The courses are also open to the general public on a spaceavailable basis.)

Classes are scheduled in the daytime and evenings and are held at consortium member sites and elsewhere in the community.

The Monterey Bay Consortium has been operating for over a year. So far, hundreds of employees have taken classes provided by the consortium, in such subject areas as human resource management, management and supervision, project management, and computer science and engineering.
