SANTA CRUZ — Thousands of people poured into the inaugural Tequila and Taco Music Festival in San Lorenzo Park Saturday. Put on by the producers of the California Beer Festival in Aptos, the one-day, six-and-a-half-hour sold-out event unfolded under partly cloudy skies alongside the tranquil San Lorenzo River.

The \$10 admission included entry into the festival and access to food vendors, craft beer booths, art vendors and three live bands.

The ticket included six halfounce samples of tequila. Santa Cruz area taco vendors along with other styles of food were kept busy throughout the event. Proceeds benefit the Giammanco Foundation.


