Public Hearing On Formation Of Junior College District To Be Held At Capitola March 29

The Santa Cruz county augmented committee on school district organization will hold a public hearing Monday, March 29 at 8 p.m. at the Capitola school, to consider the formation of a junior college district in Santa Cruz county.

Expected to attend the session will be District Attorney June D. Borina and Floyd Taylor, consultant from the state department of

education.

The Santa Cruz county committee on school district organization, together with the augmented committee, composed of the school board trustees from the three high school districts would be included within the college district, have gone on record recommending that

such a district be formed.

The committe voted on the issue May 12, 1953 and at the same time recommended that an election be called for the purpose of forming such a junior college district.

The high school districts which would be included in the college district are the Santa Cruz, San Lorenzo Valley unified school district and the Watsonville joint union high school district, which embraces a portion of Monterey county.
