

Another Adult Book Store May Be In Offing

The appearance of Santa Cruz's first adult bookstore caused quite a stir in the community. A second one may be on the way.

The county zoning administrator Friday approved a proposal to set up an adult bookstore on Portola Drive near 41st Avenue.

The request must go before county supervisors for final approval.

Planned by Earl Kuhns, the bookstore proposal brought a small showing of protestors at the first zoning administrator hearing held on the item, said Myron Jacobs, acting zoning administrator.

Only a handful of protestors turned up at Friday's meeting, said Jacobs.

Most were concerned the store was located near a residential area.

The bookstore's approval

was conditioned on a plan to allow the county to re-open the permit if there are "justifiable" complaints by neighbors, said Jacobs.

County counsel noted the limits placed on material in the store would be those "defined by law as obscene."

Other business included the

following:

CHURCH STORAGE SHED — A plan to build a 4,000-square-foot storage shed for the Lehi Park Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints was okayed.

The approval is subject to the church obtaining a statement from the environmental review

committee that the storage will not damage the environment.

DUPLEX — Two duplexes on East Cliff Drive, near Warren Street, were approved by the zoning administrator.

The two-story homes will have cedar shingles, redwood siding and trim and landscaping.

ANTIQUE SHOP — An antique shop, proposed for location on Highway 9 near Boulder Creek, was continued for one week by the zoning administrator.

Problems with fence size caused the delay, said Jacobs.
