## Memorial scheduled for slain homeless man

one person who may have died unremembered," said the Rev. Mark Stetz, pastor of Holy Cross Catholic Church. "We want to recall what we do know of him and entrust him to the care of our God."

Tia Lauren Hitt, 20, and James Landrum Jones, 22, both of Fort Worth, Texas, are charged with murder. Inves-

tigators believe the couple killed Blanton after a dispute about a campsite. Prosecutor Christine McGuire said Blanton was defenseless. His right hand had been amputated after an accident.

While "lamenting the tragedy," it's also important for the community to think about how it could have been prevented. Stetz said.

"We all share a communal responsibility." he said.

Community members will have the opportunity to share stories about Blanton's life and discuss homeless issues at a reception immediately after a brief service at 7 p.m. April 9 at Holy Cross, 126 High St.
