Students To Receive \$500 Honor Awards

Seven one-year scholarships of \$500 each have been awarded students of Santa Cruz high school, San Lorenzo Valley unified high school and Holy Cross high school. (See Editorial Page 23).

Five of the scholarships were awarded by the Estelle B. Brand scholarship committee and two were presented by Sigma Alpha chapter of Omega Nu. (See separate stories).

The awards are some of the larger scholarships offered to local students.

Both Joseph R. Alcantara, chairman of the Brand committee, and Mrs. Robert Rittenhouse, chairman of the Omega Nu committee, expressed the hope that other local organizations and individuals might join in a program to provide additional scholarships for worthy students in the area.

A number of scholarships are available to local high school graduates, ranging from \$100 memorial awards to two scholarships which provide \$400 a year for four years.

Students of all the schools are also eligible to participate in several merit scholarship programs including the National Merit Scholarship project and the California State Scholarship program as well as some business achievement scholarships such as the Bank of America achievement awards.
