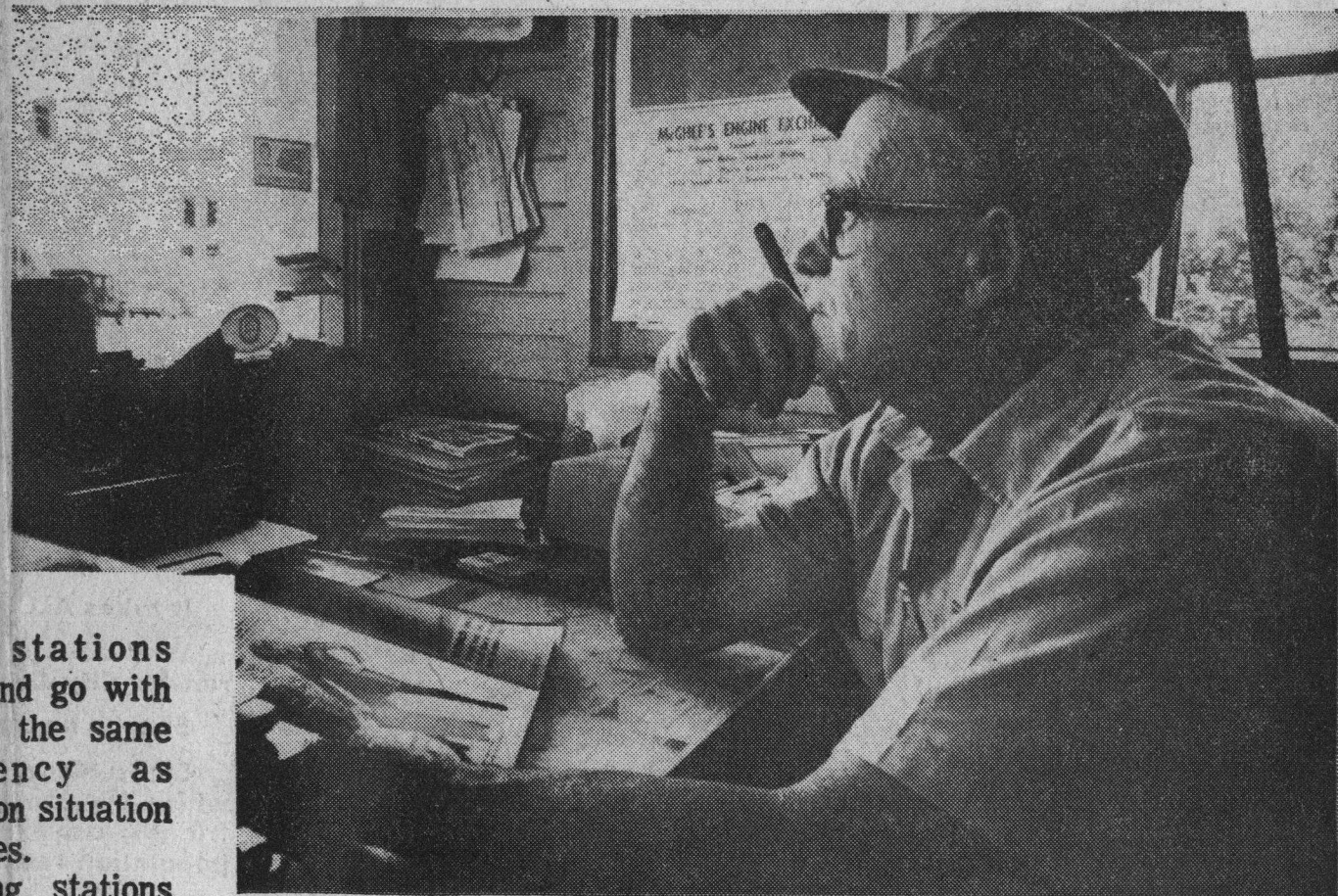

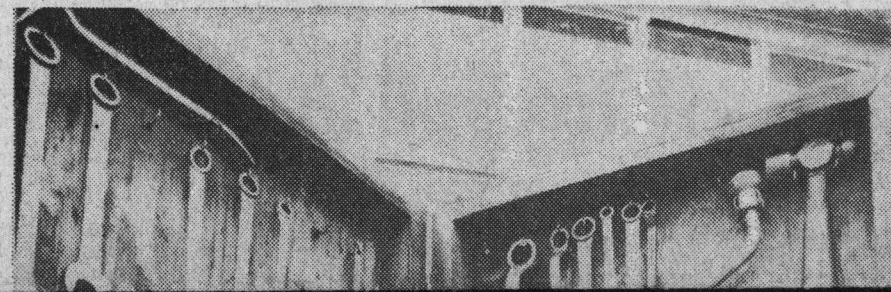

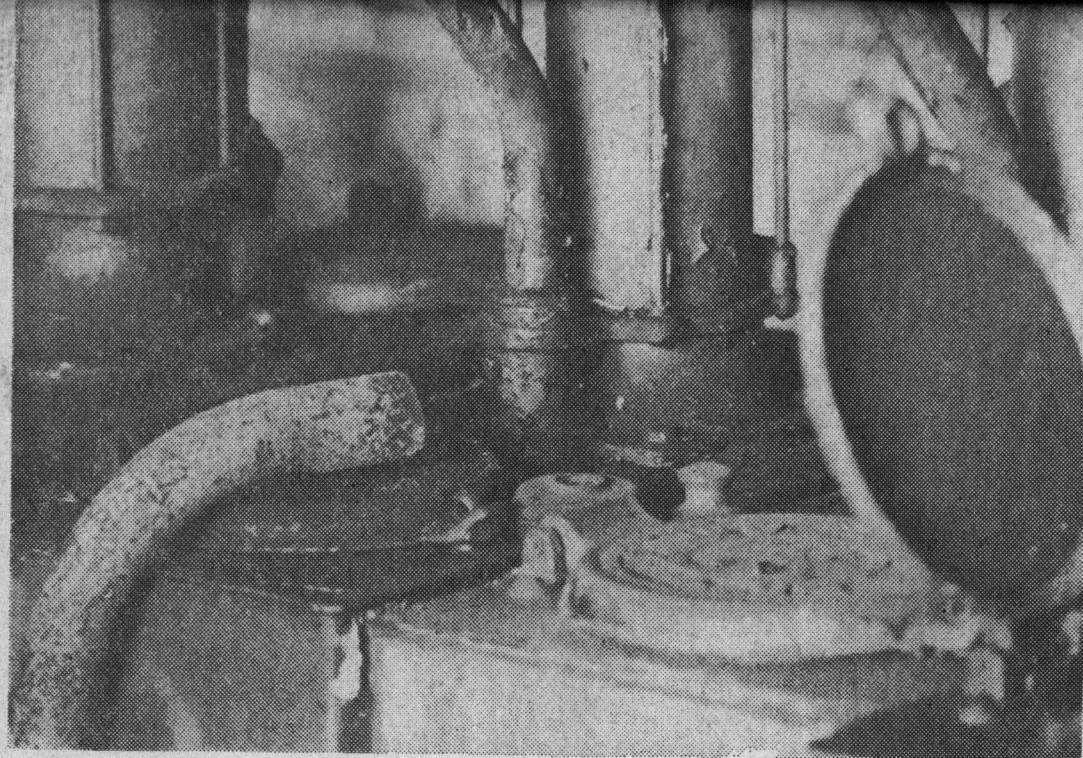


Gas stations come and go with roughly the same frequency as television situation comedies.

Why then does a station with only two pumps, an outdoor grease rack and that closes on Sunday hold a cor-





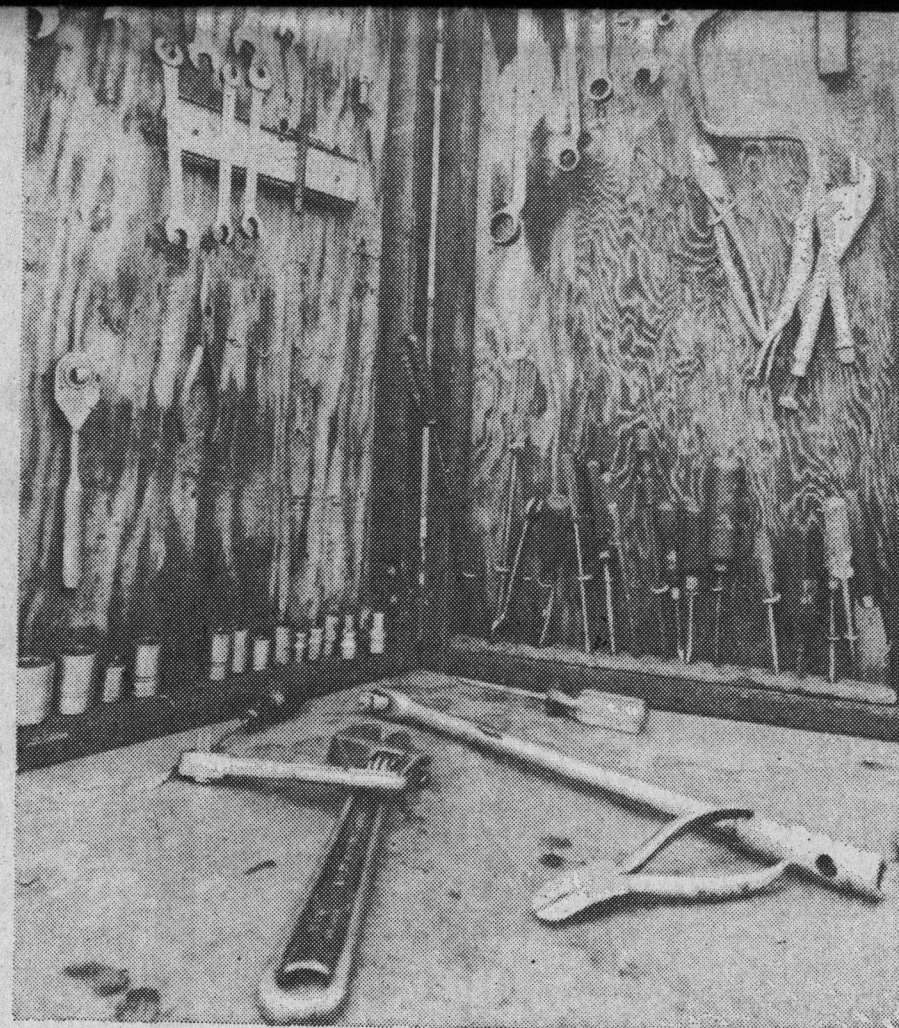
ner of the gasoline market for 26 years?
