Merchants along Pacific avenue and Front street will have opportunity to air their opinions on the proposed one-way traffic plan for those arteries at a public hearing set for 7:30 p.m. March 23, at the

city council chambers. The hearing was set by the city council last night after it authorized the city attorney to draft a proposed ordinance on the matter; requested the city manager to draft plans and asked the state division of highways to make its plans for signalization streets.

Council members also received the first public indication that some merchants, at least at this some merchants, at least at this time, have opposition to the one-

way plan.

Council members cut short any discussion from the floor about the proposal, asserting that arguments pro or con should be made

at the hearing set up for that purpose March 23. Mayor Clifford L. Dysle urged Dysle urged all merchants involved and other businessmen or residents interested in the matter to attend the session. He also suggested that merchants now opposed to the pro-posal contact the chamber of composal contact the chamber of com-merce parking committee or the citizens advisory committee adding that it is possible that their pres-ent fears can be allayed and ques-tions answered and reasons ex-plained. The committees expect to hear final recommendations on traffic circulation March 3, from Harold B. Wise, city traffic consult-ant.

The over all one-way plan is for an "inner loop" to take care of traffic circulation in the downtown with beach-bound vehicles area traveling Pacific avenue, and Front street to be used by vehicles going away from the beach.
