

Council Names Peter Tedesco City Manager

Peter Tedesco last night was formally promoted to the city manager's job with a round of verbal applause from his councilmen bosses.

The 29-year-old successor to Robert Klein has been directing the executive and administrative branch of the city as acting city manager since the resignation of Klein.

Councilman Paul Forgey led off with, "I have been pleased to work with Tedesco for the past three years on the council and I know his quiet way of doing the job has won the confidence of the city as well as the council.

"I think the city is to be congratulated as lucky to get such a young man who can run the city so smoothly and efficiently."

In welcoming Tedesco, Councilman Robert Burton jokingly added, "I hope there is some way he can forget some of the things he learned from Klein."

The rest of the council added their slightly premature congratulations and then unanimously voted the action. Tedesco will continue at the \$10,200 salary he was receiving as acting city manager. He will not officially move into his new post until November 20 because of needed time to adjust the city salary ordinance to remove Klein's \$16,500 per year figure from the books.
