

APPOINTMENTS ARE MADE TO FILL VACANCIES

The City Council adopted new procedures for appointing qualified citizens to membership on various boards, commissions and committees. In order to screen the large number of people who wanted to serve on these various boards, the Council asked that an application be made indicating the areas of interest or particular commission they wished to serve. The Council then reviewed the applications and set up appointments to interview as many of these applicants as possible.

Because of the large number of applicants, it was not possible to interview everyone who wished to serve the city in this capacity. Approximately 40 people were interviewed and the following appointments were made:

FIRE DEPARTMENT

Fire Administration has been working on the following projects during this period: A proposal for a Fire Department rescue team to include a Water Safety Officer and Lifeguards; a proposal for an alarm system on West Cliff Drive; and a report on the County Fire Protection Plan.

A metal storage building has been intalled at Station III. It will be used as a combined storage facility for miscellaneous equipment and hazardous materials not permitted to be kept in the stations.

The Weed Abatement program is now in full swing with the contractors in town discing the lots.

The Firefighting showed a 36% increase in the man hours spent on company inspections during the month of April and a 56% increase in time spent on answering alarms. The Department responded to total of 85 alarms during the month of April with one large fire to a dwelling which caused extensive damage.

Firefighters Dick Rausch and Mike Stepka were commemded by the Fire Chief for exemplary service to the Department in rescue attempts.
