Half-day Sessions At Live Oak In Fall

First, second, and third graders will definitely go on double sessions next fall in the Live Oak Elementary school district.

Trustees learned last night that half-day sessions will be necessary for those grades until new building additions are completed, about February 1.

Superintendent Herb Cartwright reported a projected enrollment of 1191 pupils for September. The district now has only 28 classrooms.

The board approved hiring of two more primary teachers, a kindergarten teacher, and one

teacher each for grades five and six.

In other business last night, the board of trustees:

—Awarded a bid on a sprinkler system at Del Mar school to Automatic Turf Equipment company of Santa Cruz. The firm's bid was \$2752.

—Signed an architectural agreement with Falk and Booth of San Francisco. Wes Hull, a representative of the firm, gave a progress report on new buildings.

—Learned that appraisal for a new 11-acre site isn't completed.

—Approved hiring of three teacher aides for fifth grade teachers. The aides are Cabrillo college students.

—Approved hook-up with Pacific Telescription service for educational television at Del Mar school.

—Approved Del Mar Principal Robert Crooks as director of the summer school program. Tentative summer session dates are July 1 through August 9.

—Set May 14-16 for the annual kindergarten "round-up."

—Re-employed John Paizis as district psychologist for three days a week each school week of the year.
