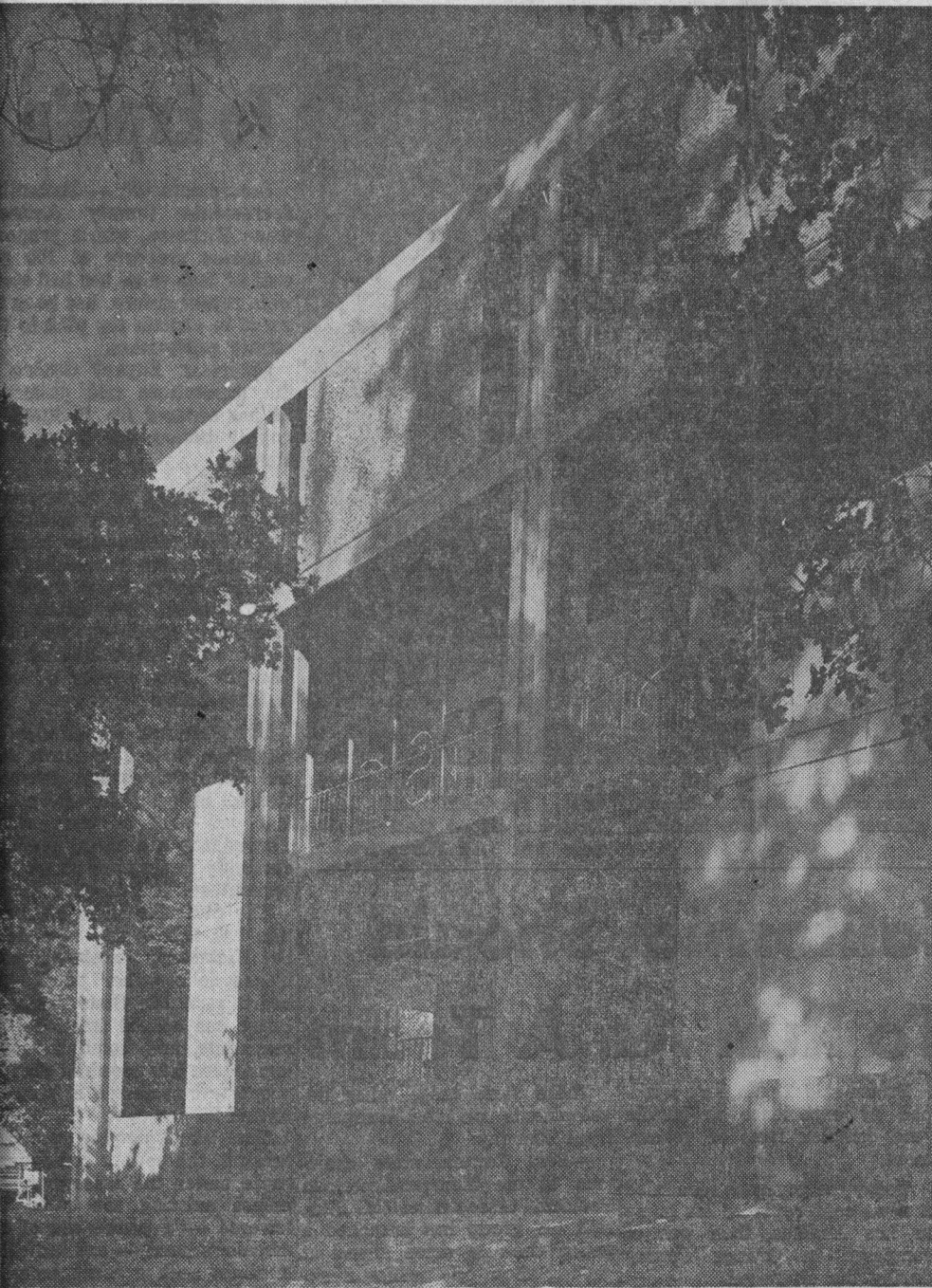

# UCSC Buildings Win Architectural Honors



Two UCSC buildings were honored today in Washington, D.C., by the American Institute of Architects and the Educational Facilities Laboratories in collaboration with the Bureau of Higher Education. Library Unit No. 1, left, received an award of merit and natural sciences unit No. 1, below, received a first honor award.

Designer of the natural sciences building was William Stephen Allan, of Anshen and Allen of San Francisco. The \$2.58-million structure con-

tains 81,500 square feet. The building, constructed by Nomellini Construction Company of Stockton, was started in March, 1964, and completed in September, 1965.

Architect of the library building was John Carl Warnecke, of John Warnecke and Associates of San Francisco. Contractor for the 102,600-square-foot building was Rothschild, Raffin and Weirick, Inc., of San Francisco. Costing \$2.32-million, it was started in January, 1965, and completed in September, 1966.

Representing the local uni-

versity campus at the award ceremonies was Donald T. Clark, UCSC librarian. Awards were presented by Commissioner Harold Howe II of the U.S. Office of Education, in the auditorium of the Department of Health, Education and Welfare.

In addition to award certificates presented to the architects, a special bronze plaque was presented for installation in the natural sciences building.
