Watsonville, CA - They're fast, they're loud and they're coming to the Watsonville Airport Memorial Day week-

Four Marine Corps AV-8 Harriers and two Navy F/18 Hornets will take center stage at the 43rd annual Watsonville Fly-In & Air Show May 25-26-27, 2007. The last time the Harriers landed in Watsonville was 2003.

"This is like a dream come true to have this kind of military support," said Dave Brockmann, marketing director. "We've never had the F/18s fly before in our air show, so this will be a very special weekend, making our Fly-In & Air Show something people will be talking about for years to come."

And, more military is on the way. Two Marine Corps CH-53 Super Stallions helicopters; two Navy SH-60B Sea Hawk helicopters; an Air Force UH-1 Huey helicopter, two C-130 Hercules transports - Coast Guard and Nevada Air National Guard, Reno; and a NASA T-34 trainer will be on display. In all, more than 70 personnel representing all branches of the military will be in Watsonville. The Coast Guard C-130 will fly in the air show Saturday and Sunday.

And there's more.

If daring stunts overhead, smoke and noise of high performance aircraft gets your heart pumping; if seeing vintage aircraft gets you to reminisce about the past; and if you like American classic cars, then the Watsonville Airport is where you'll want to spend Memorial Day weekend.

The flurry of weekend activities kicks off Friday with the traditional spaghetti dinner, dusk air show and dazzling fireworks.

Joining the military in action-packed air show on Saturday and Sunday will be the Southern California Thunder Delfins L-29 four-ship jet demo team; the Tutima

Academy of Aviation Safety precision formation flight team of Ken Erickson, Pitts S-2C, Bill "Guru" Stein, Edge 540, and Ben Freelove, Extra 300L; Eddie Andreini in his Boeing Stearman; John Collver at the controls of his AT-6 Trainer; Frank Donnelly (Dr. D) flying his Taylorcraft; skydivers Garth Harley and Wayne Wright along with the return of the Santa Clara Model Aircraft Skypark.

Hundreds of antique classic, neoclassic and homebuilt aircraft from as far as the state of Washington will be displayed on the ramp. Judging categories have been expanded this year and award winners will be announced at Saturday night's Pilot Get-Together.

New this year will be a "Shine-N-Show" car extravaganza on Saturday and Sunday with more than 200 pristine vehicles scheduled to appear from the Koolstangs, Road Angels and classic car organizations.

There will be helicopter and bi-plane rides, farm equipment display, along with food and aviation-related vendors. The Commemorative Air Force, Arizona Wing, will have its B-17 "Sentimental Journey" on display and provide rides during the three-day event.

Gates open at Noon Friday, 9 a.m. on Saturday and Sunday. Discounted advance tickets are available on the Fly-In & Air Show's website at www.watsonvilleflyin.org. Simply click on the yellow ClicknPrint emblem to purchase adult tickets \$12, child 6-12 \$4, senior and active military \$8.
