

There is considerable authority behind the metal fish sculptures by Ken Jones now on display at the Santa Cruz Main Library.

Ken is a champion skin diver and has won more than 50 trophies for his spear fishing feats.

He won the "Diver of the Year" award from the Central California Council of Divers in 1969, and in 1971 and 1972 he won spear fishing championships in the same council.

Ken's works are created by dripping molten steel, and sometimes bronze, over a framework, using an acetylene torch.

Ken, for seven years a potato chip salesman, moved from San Jose to Santa Cruz four years ago, and now makes his art his career.

He currently is displaying his sculpture in the Simmons Gallery in Old Town, Los Gatos; Parks Gallery in San Jose and Bob Limber Gallery in Cannery Row.

In March and April, his works will be on view at the Palo Alto Medical Center.
