The store will feature a "Shoe MegaShop," with nearly a quarter of the space dedicated to shoes for the entire family. Another section, "The Cube," is a boutique geared to young women with apparel organized by style with accesso-

nized by style with accessories instead of by size.

stores receive up to 10,000 new items each week. "It's like visiting a whole new store every time," said Thea Houghton, spokes-

woman for TJX, Marshalls parent company. Store buyers have relationships with more than 12,000 vendors in 60 countries, talk to them daily and buy closer to the fashion

season, she added.

The store will be staffed by 60 full-time and part-time employees. Regular hours will be 9:30 a.m. to 9:30 p.m. Monday through Saturday and 11 a.m. to 8 p.m. Sun-

day.

The grand opening in Santa Cruz is one of four planned Thursday by Marshalls; two are in Ohio and one is in New York City on the Avenue of the Ameri-

Marshalls is the second largest off-price family apparel retailer in the United States, behind its sister company, TJ Maxx.
