

Poster Artist Bio

Santa Cruz Resident James Aschbacher

rt is a chance to make magic," says James Aschbacher, the 2008 ✓ Capitola Art & Wine Festival Poster artist. A self-taught artist who lives and works in Santa Cruz, James developed his own technique of texturing illustration board with multiple layers of oil/enamel paint, on which his images are drawn and colored. Each painting is nailed onto a wooden frame that has been hand-carved and painted with mystical symbols.

"Whimsical" is the word most often applied to James' exuberant paintings with their distinctive glyph borders. In the Aschbacher universe, fish swim in the sky, animals dance, and people fly among the stars. His artwork has been

His public art projects include a triptych in the lobby, and an outdoor mural at

the Freedom Branch Library. Other public murals include "Song of Santa Cruz," on the Petroglyph building, Cedar Street, and "Adventures in Paradise" in Plaza Lane, both in downtown Santa Cruz. James has also organized several participatory mural projects painted with studentsusing their designs—at elementary schools all across the county.

James served on the Cultural Council of Santa Cruz County Open Studios Committee from 1995 to 2004; the last two years, as Chair. James also served as Visual Arts Chair for First Night Santa Cruz in 2003 and 2004. In 2005, James received a Gail Rich Award, along with his wife, writer Lisa Jensen, for their contributions to the Santa Cruz

arts community.
